

Interactive Media and Construction will require universal and correct wearing of masks for all staff members and students unless doctor has excused for health reasons.

- All students and staff are required to wear masks at all times, regardless of vaccination status to create a safe, consistent and welcoming learning environment that will foster trust in our district from student families and the community.
- Documentation from a doctor will be required for students with health concerns and will be kept on file in office/nurse's station

Interactive Media and Construction will require physical distance measures (e.g., including use of cohorts/podding);

- One student per desk
- Three- six feet apart at all times (wall/floor markers placed)
- Lunch will be in classrooms adhering to social distancing guidelines
- Limit number of students in hallways
- Limit number of students in bathroom (one student at a time)
- Smaller classroom sizes
- Plastic partitions between student work areas/teacher's desk
- Limit number of students in gym/cohorts (one classroom released at a time)

Interactive Media and Construction will follow and encourage proper handwashing and respiratory etiquette;

- CDC Handwashing guidelines posted at all sinks and in restrooms
- Handwashing stations available in every classroom
- Hand sanitizer dispensers located inside every doorway and bottles of sanitizer available throughout the school

Interactive Media and Construction will participate in cleaning and maintaining healthy facilities, including improving ventilation;

- The district will clean frequently used surfaces daily; this includes tables, doorknobs, light switches, countertops, handles, desks, phones, keyboards, toilets, faucets, and sinks.
- If someone is sick or has tested positive for COVID-19, district will disinfect frequently touched surfaces by using a household disinfectant product approved by EPA for use on COVID-19 (List N).
- If surfaces are dirty, staff will clean using detergent or soap and water prior to disinfection.

- Building lessor pays company 1x/week for deeper sanitization.
- Building is equipped with central air and air filter to help with ventilation.

Interactive Media and Construction will participate in contact tracing in combination with isolation and quarantine, in collaboration with the state, local, territorial or tribal health departments;

- The district will continue to report probable and confirmed COVID-19 cases to the health department, in accordance with applicable privacy and other laws, as soon as they are informed. While administrators are advised to defer to healthcare providers and health departments for the medical management of symptomatic students, staff, and educators and advise on their ability to safely return to class or work, administrators can be proactive regarding the following:
  - If a student, staff, educator, contractor, or volunteer is identified on campus or in a daily symptom screening check with symptoms consistent with COVID-19, the following steps will be taken:
    - Symptomatic people will immediately isolate from other students/staff regardless of vaccination status.
    - The district will expedite referral of the symptomatic person(s) to a healthcare provider to receive clinical evaluation and diagnostic testing for Covid-19.
  - If a probable or confirmed diagnosis of COVID-19 is identified in any student, staff, educator, contractor, or volunteer, the following steps will be taken:
    - Refer people diagnosed with COVID-19 for isolation per CDC guidelines and Richland County Health Department protocols, and they will not be allowed to return to the school premises until requirements to discontinue isolation are met.
    - Encourage people diagnosed with COVID-19 to contact their healthcare provider for clinical management as necessary, and advise them when to seek emergency medical attention.
    - Encourage people diagnosed with COVID-19 to answer the call from the Health Department or the school staff who be following up with them to prevent further spread of the virus.

- Encourage people to inform their contacts themselves in order for those contacts to quickly begin quarantine and seek testing while they are waiting to hear from the Health Department or school officials.
- Immediately report the case to the Richland County Health Department per reporting protocols.

Interactive Media and Construction will take part in diagnostic and screening testing;

- The district will take and record students' and staff's temperatures if they present other symptoms or admit they are not feeling well. In cases of students or staff presenting with a temperature of 100.4 or higher or any other symptoms identified by the CDC, student or staff member will be isolated and arrangements will be made for transportation home or to a medical facility for testing.
- The district will advise students and staff members to stay home if they are sick or if they have been exposed to COVID-19. The district will encourage these individuals to talk to their healthcare provider about getting a COVID-19 test.
- If a student or staff member becomes sick at school or reports a new COVID-19 diagnosis, the district will follow the steps of the COVID-19 Diagnosis flowchart on what to do next.
- School-based healthcare professionals (for example, school nurses) may perform Covid-19 testing in school-based health centers if they are trained in specimen collection.
- The district will work with public health officials to help link students and their families and staff to other opportunities for testing in their community.

Interactive Media and Construction will make efforts to provide vaccinations to educators, other staff and students, if eligible.

- All students and staff meet the age eligibility for vaccination.
- The district will continue to educate the staff and students with accurate information on vaccination opportunities in our local community.

Interactive Media and Construction will provide appropriate accommodations for children with disabilities with respect to the health and safety policies.

- The district will make appropriate accommodations based on documented doctor recommendations. If there is a doctor's statement indicating that the student is unable to wear a mask due to health issues, the district will respect the doctor's recommendation.
  - If necessary, the district will place wall and/or floor stickers to help enforce social distancing for students that need visual reminders. Also, the district will use verbal and non-verbal cues to help remind students of preventive measures.
  - Hand sanitizer will be made available to all students in every school area regardless of students' mobility.
  - Through the safety measures of social distancing, the district will ensure that students will not be closer than three feet with others.

The district will ensure the continuity of services including but not limited to services to address the students' academic needs. The framework of the district's educational program is structured to meet Ohio Learning Standards (OLS) to prepare the students for state assessments and make them college, military and/or career ready. IMAC is a brick-and-mortar computer-based school with certified staff on site. The district will ensure the continuity of services including but not limited to services to address the students' social, emotional, mental health, and other needs too. Flexible scheduling, individualized learning plans and a supportive climate are essential for the dropout prevention/recovery population to achieve success academically, socially, and emotionally. When creating Individual Learning Plans, the district determines academic and behavioral needs by formative/summative assessments, along with 40 Developmental Assests surveys, Positive Behavioral Intervention Supports (PBIS), and trauma informed school interventions.

Student Success Plans are used collaboratively by the student and staff to facilitate and document course placement/completion, charting growth across the curriculum in areas of proficiency and deficiency. BASE is a program that the district offers to all students and staff that gathers data from formative and

summative assessments. As students regulate their emotions and behaviors, develop relationship skills and social awareness, and practice critical decision making to plan for their futures, BASE Education is a powerful tool at the heart of that work.

The district will ensure the continuity of food services. Through group health insurance programs offered by the district, staff members are able to seek mental health services when needed.

Wraparound services are provided through partnerships with Family Life and Psychological Services, the Urban Minority Alcohol and Drug Abuse Outreach Program (UMADAOP), Richland County Juvenile Justice Center, Richland County Children Services and the Domestic Violence Shelter. IMAC is a safe and non-threatening learning environment which supports social and character development in our students and staff alike. Across the curriculum all staff integrate higher order questioning strategies to develop higher order thinking skills at every grade level in each student. Reading and math are integrated into all subjects. Course work is both relevant and applicable to the students beyond the classroom. Technology is incorporated as a tool to support lesson delivery and data use. Project based learning will be part of the district's curriculum. Past activities have included: class projects, art, dance, music production, construction, entrepreneurship, digital media and State Tested Nurses Aid (STNA). The district will work to expand our use of classroom-based projects. IMAC has partnered with North Central State College, OSU Mansfield, Companions of Ashland, and similar partnerships to provide college readiness pathways support and career readiness pathway supports. The district will strive to continue and expand these and other partnerships to continue to provide a unique educational program based on our students' needs.

The district will ensure the continuity of services including but not limited to services to address the students' Food service director will continue to take part in learning and professional-development opportunities regarding current and new food safety guidelines. District will continue to comply with the USDA and National School Lunch Program to provide healthy meals to the students upon return to in-person learning.

The district fosters a supportive climate by implementing PBIS building-wide. District will use PBIS strategies including offering praise to motivate and encourage students to follow safety protocols and social-distancing.

Interactive Media and Construction will periodically review this plan, no less frequently than every six months for the duration of the ARP ESSER grant period (i.e., through September 30, 2023), and revise the plan as deemed appropriate.
